Back home, there is lots to do such as making new rooted cuttings, potting up finished ones, harvesting corn, pole beans, tomatoes, plums, and blackberries.

At one month, seven out of eleven true cherimoya flowers are holding small fruits, thanks to hand-pollinating twice a day. I have a little extra pollen left over and it's going on some sugar apple flowers soon to hopefully make my own Atemoyas.
