






















The Citrus Celebration – write up by George Campani

The Tampa Rare Fruit Council has continued its long history once again this year with the production of its annual event: the Citrus Celebration in the "Special Events Center Building" on Sunday, February 16, 2025 at the Florida State Fair. It was a nice sunny morning when we began preparing for our 25th (missed one during the pandemic) Citrus Celebration at the Florida State Fair. The Club's Citrus Celebration started in 1998 through2001 in the Botanical Garden at USF, before moving to The State Fair in the year 2002.

There continues to be challenges producing this Annual Event, the biggest being citrus has become much harder to get in the last few years because of Citrus Greening (a bacterial disease spread by the Asian Citrus Psyllid). We have not lost some, but most of our suppliers over the years from Citrus Greening and we must find new suppliers each year and each year, there are fewer suppliers out there. Good luck next year!

This year Paul Branesky lost his orange supplier for making orange juice. However, somehow, he was inspired to search for another source. This was a difficult task, with the industry fighting Citrus Greening and this year's hurricanes reducing the citrus harvest, and yes, there was less citrus to find; but invariably, through Paul's perseverance he found a new supplier; John Stephens and his Citrus Packing House and John donated a Bin of Vernia Oranges for juice making and a carton of Vernia Oranges for tasting. Thank you, John! Paul made a great tasting orange juice with the sweet and smooth tasting Vernia Oranges.

The many hard-working volunteers once again cut oranges for tasting, and placed out trays. Other volunteers manned the Display Tables with its many citrus varieties on display, they answered questions, and had conversations on their growing experience. There they handed out literature on growing citrus donated by the U.F. Citrus Research and Education Center in Lake Alfred.

Hillary Cosenza had many varieties of citrus trees for sale for the Fairgoers who might be interested in trying to grow a well-known plant in Florida.

Since our Club promotes growing many varieties of semi-tropical plants, there was passion fruit juice, soursop fruit juice, mango fruit juice, pina colada fruit juice, and guava fruit juice by the cup to be purchased by the Fairgoers. Great job Dylan Chadwell and KC Gonzalez!

Mostly what's happening lately is pruning and weeding. All grapes are done, and they are starting to wake up. Avocado trees need to be topped at twelve

to fifteen feet. A few are done and need to be sprayed for lacebugs and thrips.

I finished burning a seventh brush pile of hurricane debris. The ashes are spread around to provide potassium for the yard plants and vegetable gardens.

Tomatoes are ripening at a fast pace. More carrots were planted, and the first pole beans of the season are coming up.

Starfruit are ripening, as the last of the persimmons are about done. The black sapote is giving up the biggest ever crop. The fruit is mildly sweet, dark brown, and pasty in texture. I guess it is an acquired taste for some, but I like it.

I planted sugar apple and more passionfruit seeds. All the grape trellises have been refurbished and I installed three more vines.
